The program commenced with the welcome address by Ms. Rutuja Parkhi.


Dr. Lakhani explained the Do's and Don'ts of Email Etiquette. Some of the areas that were discussed by her were: Subject line



• We all are born out of the environment. If we start ruining it, we are ending our own existence. The barter system, leading to Silk Route to landlord system that humanity has seen, all this has led to "prosperity" defined by money. However, has also led to disruption in the balance of nature.

• Through story of Amul, Chhaya Ma'am shared the success of White revolution in Gujarat brought about by Mr. Verghese Kurien that changed the lives of villages and especially women in these villages. Ma'am also shared the example of ITC that has brought about changes in the lives of farmers, giving more employment and education opportunities to the residents of the villages.

• TedX talk by Mr. Rohit Deshpande was also referred to by Chhaya Ma'am. The video depicted the attack on Taj Hotel, Mumbai. It was a case study that was undertaken by Mr. Rohit Deshpande. 

World Oceans Day - Symposium on Sustaining Life Below Water

Keynote Speaker: Dr. Mangesh Kashyap, President, SEERAM, Pune

• Dr. Kashyap is devoted to the development of the youth of tomorrow for navigating their focus towards sustaining our Mother Earth and its life forms.

• The cause of water and water conservation is very close to his heart. He believes that equal and efficient use of water and services allocation and distribution can bring a real turnaround in socio economic activities and ecosystems.

• In addition to the above, some self-realizations and accountabilities can also bring the desired changes on a global platform, giving this subject its due importance and recognition. Driven by the same, he founded Crisil Verified NGO SEERAM-Environmental Sustainability Research Foundation.

• Dr. Kashyap emphasized that economy, environment and social community are the three pillars for sustainable development in any country.

• He further stated that the universality and integration of the SDGs challenge all globally to act on these for a better future.

• Dr. Kashyap spoke extensively about the 14th UN SD Goal – Life below water. In India, about 35% of the population live within 100 km of the country's coastline measuring around 7500 km. Even though the sea level rise is a very slow phenomenon, the trends of sea level rise are estimated to be 1.3mm/year along the Indian coasts during the last 40 -50 years due to changes in the climate.

• Dr. Kashyap put forth a few solutions to reduce the negative impact on the oceans and their life forms:

- Mangroves and Coral reef protection
- Coastal erosion protection
- Sustainable fisheries management
- Reduce Marine Pollution
- Sustainable tourism

• Eco friendly shipping

Guest Speaker: Ms. Megan Dsouza, Youth Mentor, Samvada NGO, Mangalore

• Megan is a true inspiration for the millennials today. Yearning to make the planet safe and sustainable, she has worked as Communications Head at Anti-Pollution Drive Foundation, an NGO based in Mangalore. She is presently working at Samvada as a Youth Mentor and believes she has found her calling.

• She began her session with quoting a narrative from Sir David Attenborough's documentary 'Blue Planet: Take a Deep Breath', "For years we thought the oceans were so vast and the inhabitants so infinitely numerous that nothing we could do could have an effect upon them. But now we know that was wrong," says Attenborough. "It is now clear our actions are having a significant impact on the world's oceans. [They] are under threat now as never before in human history. Many people believe the oceans have reached a crisis point."

• Megan further pointed out that the sustainability of oceans is under severe threat due to marine pollution, ocean warming, fishery collapse to name a few.

• She projected data and numbers that denoted increase in CO2 concentrations, effects of the Great Pacific Garbage Patch, increase in the carbon footprints all due to the insane and uncontrolled global practices.

- She put forth introspective questions to the audience:
 - When the glaciers melt, who will be affected first?
 - \circ When the sea-level rises, who will be affected most?
 - \circ Who has to deal with the waste being thrown into the oceans?
 - Who will be affected by the dwindling population of fish?

• Through various articles and news clips from eminent papers, journals and documentaries, she brought out the ill effects that 'humanization' has had on life below water.

• She concluded her session by saying that climate justice is a social problem that affects the flora and fauna, the poor and the rich, in that order. It is about time that each of us takes corrective measures to sustain our future on this rare blue planet with scare and fast dwindling resources.

Dr. Divya Lakhani gave her HOD's address wherein she too presented her views on World Oceans Day. Ms. Sonali Joshi, on behalf of the Global Connect Cell team, thanked all the participants, especially the guests from DAMITS, Odisha, who graced the event with their virtual presence.


Speaker Name: CA Hemant Godse

CA Hemant Godse started his session by explaining the importance of ratio analysis in business organizations. Ratios Analysis is used by Tax Authorities, Bankers, Investors & Advisors in analyzing the past to take future decisions and it is also helpful to take investment, lending decisions, and other decisions within the enterprise.

He explained the prerequisites of ratio analysis: an analytical mind, common sense, knowledge of industry, Balance Sheet with all its links, notes, reports, laws, & allied documents. Further he explained different ratios: Liquidity, Activity, Profitability, Capital Structure / Leverage ratios.

Mr. Godse said that while doing Ratio analysis of any business organization one should take into consideration following factors:

- Find out correlations between the ratios. No ratio should be interpreted in isolation. Standards prescribed for different ratios are idealistic. Counter-effect of each ratio should be studied very carefully. Find out complimentary ratios & analyze all such ratios together.
- Ratio Analysis is not conclusive analysis. One requires other corroborative information to draw conclusions about financial health.
- Always remember basic financial management rules:
 - 1. Do not divert short term funds for long term uses.
 - 2. Strike perfect balance between profitability & liquidity.
 - 3. Rotate liquidity wheel maximum number of times to increase profitability

SEVA programme at Kalote, Thakurwadi, Tal Khopoli, Dist Raigad

A need analysis undertaken in this area made volunteers realise that non-availability of resources and continuous heavy rain had created obstacles for school going children; many would miss school simply because they had no footwear or raincoats to protect themselves from the adverse weather conditions. Also, financial constraints made it difficult for parents to buy stationery, notebooks etc. To encourage them in their quest for education, Sadhu Vaswani Mission, our Founding Body, provided them with Footwear, Raincoats, and school stationary.

As a part of community outreach, Dr Abhijeet Kaiwade, PO, NSS, and 21 student volunteers [out of which 16 are NSS volunteers], along with Sadhu Vaswani Mission volunteers, visited Kalote, Thakurwadi, Raigad. This is a tribal village (ref: 16th Rashtriya Jan Ganana February 2021 (Census 2021)).

The Mission, in pursuance of the values lived by the Great Masters — Gurudev Sadhu Vaswani and Rev. Dada J.P. Our own students were found teary eyed when they faced realities of children being deprived of education owing to absence of essentials. Some of them made resolves to help the children and destitute as soon as they reach a meaningful economic standard.

CONCEPT OF THE PROGRAM

Menstrual hygiene is a problem for adolescent girls in low and middle income groups, particularly when attending school. Poor sanitation and hygiene facilities in schools, inadequate puberty education and lack of hygienic absorbents / sanitary items cause girls to experience menstruation as shameful and uncomfortable. Over and above this, the girls feel fear and humiliation from leaking of blood and body odour, which leads menstruating girls to skip the school.

The aim of holding this workshop was to address these issues and also demonstrate to the girls (between Class V to X) making of hygienic and cost effective cloth pads to help them have comfortable periods.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

SVIMS arranged for a workshop on cloth pad making at two schools in Undri and Pisoli area. The names of the schools are as follows-

- Bloomfield House of Knowledge School, Raj Vihar Society, Sr. No - 50/2/1, Jagadamba Bhawan Road, opposite Sunshine Hills, Undri, Pune, Maharashtra 411060
- Mahatma Jyotirao Phule High School, Yewalewadi, Shree Siddhivinayak Meera, Pisoli, Pune, Maharashtra 411048 The workshop was planned with a view to create awareness about adolescent menstrual hygiene. Prof Sonali Joshi spoke to the young girls about periods,

menstrual hygiene and the ways to keep themselves healthy and active during 5 days. As the girls were from standard 5th to 10th standard, a few of them were aware about periods and some of them didn't know. What was more surprising was that this was not even discussed at their homes; their mothers hadn't yet informed or shared with them about this natural phenomenon. The SVIMS faculty and the students shared their experiences to reiterate-

- Periods are nothing to be scared of
- Periods are nothing to be ashamed of.

Ms. Pratiksha Punekar, along with two trained ladies Mrs. Priyanka Nanaware and Mrs Ratna Bala Bhairat (from Kamakhya NGO), started with the workshop of making cloth pads.


The material required for the workshop was shared with the schools two days in advance so that the girls were ready for the workshop. The material required was Paper and pen, Scissor, Old towel, Old Cotton cloth, Needle and thread and Buttons.

SVIMS girls, alongwith Didis, helped the young students to make the cloth pads. The girls were all full of smiles by the end of the workshop.

As both the schools were Co-Ed, Ms. Asawari Nawale conducted Arts session for the boys while the workshop for girls was in progress.

Once the pad making workshop was over, all the students were then brought together for a dance session by Ms. Namrata Nagpal. The SVIMS Faculty and students were felicitated at both the schools and were thanked by the authorities for conducting the workshop. They also extended their invitation to the team for conducting such workshops in future too.

The day had been a fruitful one, giving a sense of achievement and satisfaction. It also made us realize that there are still places and pockets where talking about menstrual hygiene, periods, is still cringed upon. When asked "how many girls have their periods", there were many who lowered their heads while raising their hands. They were asked to hold their heads high as this is a blessing of Lord Almighty given to women.



EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

CONCEPT OF THE PROGRAM


Legal awareness is imperative to safeguard the rights of women and promote women's equity and empowerment. There is a rising need for spreading awareness among women, especially in underprivileged areas, about their legal rights and entitlements under various women-related laws. SVIMS invited Advocate Rani Manik Sonawane to acquaint the women at Sant Gadge Maharaj Vasti of their legal rights, provisions of various women-related laws and free legal services being provided by the legal services institutions to the women in need.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- The Guest Speaker was welcomed and felicitated by the students of SVIMS. In the HOD's address, Dr. Abhijeet Kaiwade shared the aim behind conducting the event and also invited the attendees to make the best of the opportunity and ask any questions that they might have in the Open House session.
- Advocate Sonawane began the session by sensitizing the women about certain legal terms and addressing myths that are society driven. She emphasized on the importance of being aware of your own assets Stree Dhan, documents, being aware of the marital family's income, husband's income, property insurance etc. inorder to create their own safety net.
- Women give priority to family commitments over their personal commitments. While performing their duties as a wife, a daughter, a mother or any other role, she must not ignore her own rights and needs.
- Rani Ma'am further shared about Rights of women pertaining to divorce, live in relationship, being a second wife or an uninformed first wife, domestic violence from parents or relative etc.
- She emphasized on the legal rights of unmarried girls / daughters. She stated that no one can throw an unmarried girl / daughter out of the house. She also added that incase there is a young girl without any living family member, she can approach any of the government shelters to support herself.
- She spoke about the free legal aid and services and other provisions available at the Family court of the Local /State / High Court for harassed women. and

services at FC. Rani Ma'am herself is a qualified counselor appointed with the Pune Court, Shivajinagar.

- She spoke highly about the Damini Squad, Pune Chapter and recommended every women to save their number on their speed dial.
- Adv Sonawane mentioned various government schemes for women such as Ujjwala Gas connection schemes, Rajiv Gandhi Niradhar Yojana, Mudra Yojana, services from State Corporation etc that are all designed to help the women in need, and to help them to become self-reliant and self-dependent.
- During the Open House session, many of the attendees asked questions. One of them was regarding rights of a second wife. Rani Ma'am informed that even though there is no provision for the second wife in Family Act 1984, but under the Domestic violence Act 2005, she may get some relief incase of physical or mental harassment / assault.
- She also shared about Section 375 of the Indian Penal Code that deals with rape and provisions of the same. This also covers any fraudulent statements or false promises of marriage that may result in 7 years of imprisonment and/or 5 lakhs rupees as fine.
- On being asked about the hereditary rights of girls in India, she informed that a daughter is also a coparcener like a son, i.e., she has a right to the family property by birth. She inherits equally as a son in her father's property, whether self-acquired or ancestral. The marital status of the daughter does not matter. As a wife, a Hindu female gets an equal share as her children in her husband's property if he dies. They are Class I heirs. A mother also has a right to the property of her son.
- For the question, "Two people have gotten married but not registered, still legal?" Rani Ma'am responded by giving examples of various circumstances, the documents that can work as proof such as marriage photos, marriage wedding invitation, relative testimony, priest marriage certificate etc.
- Towards the end of the session, she spoke about the provisions of Domestic ViolenceAct2005(<u>https://www.indiacode.nic.in/bitstream/123456789/15436/1/protection_of_women_from_domestic_violence_act%2C_2005.pdf</u>). The Act covers all women who may be mother, sister, wife, widow or partners living in a shared household. The relationship may be in nature of marriage or adoption. In addition, relationships with family members living together as a joint family are also included. Even after the session concluded, there were many women, young girls and students who approached Adv Sonawane for more guidance. She graciously answered all their queries and encouraged them to speak up for themselves, fight for their rights and trying to be relevant always.


Guru Purnima is celebrated to honour our teachers, who remove the darkness from our minds. They have had a special place in the lives of their followers since ancient times.

Farzin Khan recited a beautiful Arabic couplet in praise of Allah and the power of forgiveness.


Ms. Kiran Rajpurohit danced on a beautiful song titled 'Worthy is the lamb' and had everyone enthralled with her performance.

As per the UGC Circular and guidelines on Partition Horrors Remembrance Day, an exhibition was conducted at SVIMS on 12th August 2022.



EXECUTIVE SUMMARY


Ms. Sonali Joshi, faculty, welcomed the students, faculty and staff members for the event. She briefed the attendees about the importance of the day.



We have to not just save money but also invest it because of inflation.

Additionally, he went on to explain why one shouldn't put all of their eggs in one basket, but explore a variety of investment opportunities to put their money to work in case one doesn't work out.

He continued by describing the characteristics of successful investors, including patience, discipline, and focus. He also discussed how financial behavior focuses on investor behavior and decision-making techniques.

Mr. Chawla emphasized on the need for investment for it will help us to tide over the rainy days.


These children were excited and happy to meet all of us. They were in their festive best – clothes and spirits.


EXECUTIVE SUMMARY



CONCEPT OF THE PROGRAM



Report

A skit was performed by the students to bring about the theme of The Right Conduct towards menstruation. The skit was about a young girl who gets her periods for the first time, about her mother and the grandmother. The skit beautifully depicted the innocence of the young girl child, the situation of the mother caught between her 'grown' up daughter and the diktats of the grandmother who has her set of beliefs regarding periods. The young girl, more than the physical pain, is going through the emotional and mental pain of being 'ostracized' by the family for *those five days* for no fault of hers; so much so that her mother too cannot help but follow the rules of the house.

• The skit brought about many an emotion in the audience wherein the girls shared their experiences. Even today, those who hail from villages, face this treatment. They opined that it is embarrassing as everyone in the neighborhood get to know 'woh baahar hai'. There is a dire need for menstruation to be treated as a normal phenomenon and also understand that even though women need rest during their periods, they are not invalidated or incapacitated to work.

• Another student also addressed the concern of girls as young as the age of 8 or 9 getting their periods due to changing lifestyles. As such, there is now more need for early education for the girls as well as the boys regarding menstruation. There must be empathy and support rather than being treated as a victim or someone impure.

- To increase awareness of how to handle problems like sexual harassment at workplace.


SUMMARY

She contemplates committing a suicide. Her close friend and colleague confront her. The victim then talks about the sexual harassment she has been facing. The friend counsels her and convinces her to file a complaint. The victim does so, and the boss is imprisoned.

• The enactment was much appreciated and ended with an explanation of forms of sexual harassment in offices, in buses, at bus stops, schools, and institutions etc and reasons why such incidents are not reported; laws that prohibit sexual harassment at workplace; ICC etc.

• Finally, the skit was concluded by saying, "We have law, but you need to raise your voice and say No means No".

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
Managing Cultural Diversity in Professional Space

Cyber Crime Awareness-Celebration of Cyber Jagruti Divas

Cybersecurity Awareness Day (also known as Cyber Jagrukta Diwas) is an event that is organized to raise awareness about the importance of cybersecurity and educate people about various cyber threats such as phishing links. After that, the hacker disabled the link. Victims were waiting for seven days to pass. After 7 days, victims tried to access the same link, but it was no longer active. In response, one victim suggested reporting the scam. The cyber security officer was annoyed and expressed regret that despite their advising people not to click on unknown links, people go ahead and do so and cause losses to themselves. The Officer promised to help and investigate the issue. The next day however the officer gave the victims the bad news that the link had been closed for a long time, hence the hacker could not be traced/ identified.

The skit and the scenario described is an effective way of raising awareness about the dangers of phishing scams and the importance of being cautious when it comes to online security. By showing the consequences of falling for a phishing link and investing money, the skit highlighted the need for due diligence and caution when making online transactions. The role of the cyber security officer in the skit demonstrates the importance of seeking help and reporting incidents to professionals. The fact that the link was closed for a long time and the hacker could not be traced serves as a reminder that once a phishing link is closed, it becomes difficult to retrieve lost funds, emphasizing the need for vigilance in protecting personal and sensitive information.
