

<b>Action Taken Reports on Stakeholders' Feedback</b>
<b>Academic Year 2022 -2023</b>

**[Based on Feedback of Semester I and III]**

The analysis of feedback was undertaken by IQAC and presented as Report for enabling suitable Action.

The analysis was also presented to Governing Council and the following actions were initiated:

**Semester -I and III**

1. The Director was provided with the feedback analysis report, and after this evaluation, the Director engaged in one-on-one conversations with every faculty member. As a result of the received feedback, the Director conveyed to the entire faculty the imperative of integrating further case studies, fostering group discussions, and promoting debates within the classroom environment.

**As an Action Plan it was proposed that formal training be imparted for developing cases and also to include it as pedagogical method.**

**It was also decided that some formal training would be done to integrate more of ICT in pedagogy to lead to higher student ratings.**

2. Given the Feedback on curriculum of Marketing by faculty [after COVID, the Marketing scape has undergone a change] and changes in HR that have happened [ feedback by Faculty on HR curriculum], it was decided that letters suggesting changes in Marketing and HR curriculum would be sent to Board Of Studies, Savitribai Phule Pune University.

**[Based on Feedback of Semester I and III]**

The analysis of feedback was undertaken by IQAC and presented as Report for enabling suitable Action.

The analysis was also presented to Governing Council and the following actions were initiated:

- The Director provided guidance to faculty members regarding the integration of contemporary pedagogical approaches, practical case studies, adapting class tempo to

students' levels of comprehension, and placing equal emphasis on program and course objectives.

## Analysis:

In case of infrastructure and support services feedback on a scale of 1-5, 5 being Excellent, 1 Being Poor the total of five, four and three shows that:


- Maximum that is 87% of students are satisfied with the Ambience and Cleanliness, Audio Visual Facilities, Ventilation and Seating Arrangement of Classroom
- A total of 90% of students are satisfied with the Physical infrastructure of the Library, Books, Journals available in the library, and Library staff.
- 97 % of students are satisfied with Computer Laboratory, Wi-Fi, Internet Facility, and Internet Speed.
- 90% of students are satisfied with the services provided by office staff.
- On average 79% of students are satisfied with the Drinking Water facility, Washroom Cleanliness and maintenance, Greenery in the campus, and Cleanliness and maintenance of premises.

Thus, students seem to be satisfied with infrastructure and support services.
